NEWSPAPER LISTINGS FOR HOUSING

The city's two daily newspapers, *The Boston Globe* and *The Boston Herald*, have extensive apartment listings in their classified sections. The *Boston Phoenix* also comes out weekly with listings for the entire Boston area and can be picked up at the subway stops - free!

Local and community papers, including *The Cambridge Chronicle*, *The Arlington Advocate*, *South End News* and *The Boston, Brookline and Newton Tabs* come out weekly and have listings for their respective areas.
